The primary PE and sport premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2023 to 2024 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

DfE - VISION All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

OBJECTIVE: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

Indicators of such improvement to include:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles (KI1)
- the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement (KI2)
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport (KI3)
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils (KI4)
- increased participation in competitive sport (KI5)
