The themes we are focusing on in this book are **power, responsibility and morality**

Throughout this book, we will explore ideas about **power, responsibility and morality** by looking at the story from both the rabbit's and the wolf's point of view. We will think about why the rabbit feels afraid, how the wolf is shown as powerful, and what makes us describe a character as 'good', 'bad' or 'evil'. We will also discuss whether the characters' actions are fair or unfair, and how this affects our judgement of them.

Plot

A rabbit borrows a book about wolves from the library. As she reads, the wolves in the book seem to come to life around her. The rabbit learns many facts about wolves, but the story becomes tense when a wolf appears in the real world and approaches her.

The book offers two endings: a scary implied ending and an alternative, funny ending where the wolf and the rabbit become friends.
