


# Journeys: Which continents have we travelled to?



Continents	Oceans
<p>There are seven continents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Europe</li> <li>• Asia</li> <li>• Africa</li> <li>• North America</li> <li>• South America</li> <li>• Antarctica</li> <li>• Australia (also known as Australasia and Oceania)</li> </ul>	<p>There are five oceans:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pacific <b>Ocean</b></li> <li>• Atlantic <b>Ocean</b></li> <li>• Indian <b>Ocean</b></li> <li>• Southern <b>Ocean</b></li> <li>• Arctic <b>Ocean</b></li> </ul>



Important Vocabulary	
<b>Earth</b>	The planet we live on
<b>Globe</b>	A round model of our Earth
<b>Continent</b>	A very large area of land that consists of many countries. Europe is a <b>continent</b> .
<b>Country</b>	An area of land that is controlled by its own government
<b>Ocean</b>	One of the five very large areas of salt water on the Earth's surface.
<b>Sea</b>	A large area of salty water which is part of an ocean.
<b>Equator</b>	An imaginary line drawn on the Earth dividing it into northern and southern hemispheres
<b>Southern hemisphere</b>	The half of Earth which is south of the Equator
<b>Northern hemisphere</b>	The half of Earth which is north of the Equator

<b>Physical features</b>	These are features on Earth that are formed by nature. E.g. mountain, beach, hill, sea, ocean
<b>Human features</b>	These are features that are built by humans. E.g. town, harbour, house
