


# Roman Britain


*How was Britain changed by the Roman Empire?*



Roman Empire	All of the lands and foreign people ruled by the Romans
Emperor	The sole ruler of the Roman Empire, usually based in the city of Rome
Province	A section of the empire ruled by a governor
Legionary	A trained Roman soldier who carried a range of equipment and could work effectively as part of a group
Legion	A group of legionaries (usually around 5,000)
Centurion	An important soldier in charge of a century (a group of about 80 legionaries)
Britons/Celts	Words sometimes given to the Iron Age tribes living in Britain when the Romans arrived
Raid	An armed invasion in which the raiders are trying to cause damage, steal valuables and cause fear
Conquest	This means defeating an opponent in war and then taking over their territory; we could say that their territory now belongs to the winner's "empire"
Governor	A Roman ruler who rules a province for the emperor
Resistance	This means fighting back against an invader to prevent raiding or conquest
Rebellion	This means you have surrendered to your enemy but later decide to fight against them, usually to force them to leave
Picts	An iron age tribe that lived in the north of Britain—what is now Scotland
Innovations	New ideas or inventions
