Denmark is made up of lots of islands—there are over 400.

LEGO comes from Denmark, and the word LEGO means 'play well'.

Around 40 billion LEGO bricks are made each year—enough to reach the moon if stacked on top of each other.

Denmark is home to the world's first amusement park, called Tivoli Gardens, which opened in 1843.

The Danish flag, called the Dannebrog, is the oldest continuously used flag in the world, used for over 800 years.

Denmark is the 3rd happiest country in the world according to the 2026 World Happiness Report.

Intro to UNICEF in Denmark

In Denmark, UNICEF plays an important role in supporting children around the world. In its capital city of Copenhagen, UNICEF has a special centre called the Supply Division.

From this centre, essential supplies like vaccines, medicine, food and school materials are delivered to over 160 countries. These supplies help children stay healthy, continue their education and grow safely.

The Copenhagen centre includes one of the world's largest humanitarian warehouses. Here, supplies are carefully stored and prepared for rapid delivery. When emergencies happen, like natural disasters or conflicts, these items can be dispatched quickly to reach children in need so they can access their rights. UNICEF also works with a global network of hubs and warehouses, including one in Dubai, so children receive supplies as quickly as possible.

Carla's Visit

In this video, Carla visits the UNICEF Supply Division in Copenhagen, Denmark, where her dad works.

The Supply Division sends items like medication, food or education and clean water kits to places where floods, conflict, drought or earthquakes have happened.

The supplies sent from Copenhagen help children stay healthy, safe (Article 24) and able to continue learning (Article 28).

UNICEF works with warehouses and transport teams across the world to make sure emergency supplies can reach children as quickly as possible when big events happen.
