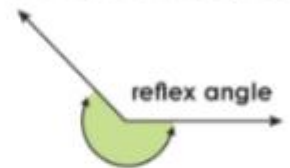

A Reflex Angle

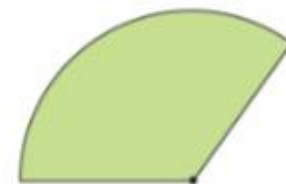
An angle between 180° and 360°

used to measure the size of an angle.

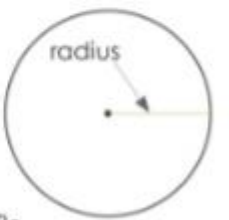

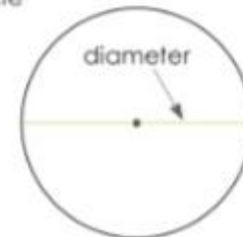
